We want someone with a passion for lifelong learning and development, excellent communication and interpersonal skills and a desire to help us achieve our mission of 'Solving skin and wound challenges together'

Responsibilities of the Education Programme Facilitator

Study Days - the Society runs a programme of around twelve Foundation Study Days and four Advanced Study Days per year. These are mainly virtual and are attended by up to 300 delegates with an industry show case running throughout the breaks

- To work with the TVS and its Marketing Agency to agree subject matter for our programme of Foundation study Days (FSD) and Advanced Study Days (ASD) over the year
- To design and develop the agenda for each study day, including learning objectives and content plan for each event
- To source appropriate speakers and liaise with them to agree content of presentations in line with the TVS' non promotional policy.
- Work closely with the Marketing Agency on the preparation of these events to ensure a seamless experience for our delegates, so they can focus on improving their knowledge of skin health and wound healing

- When required, be the moderator for the study days, including general hosting responsibilities and management of the live Q&A sessions.

Webinars - The society runs a series of one hour evening webinars over the year - usually around ten. Four of these are sponsored by Industry and six are led by the TVS focussing on topical content and the training needs of the members

- To work with the TVS and its Marketing Agency to agree subject matter for the TVS webinar programme, developing the agenda for each event, including learning objectives and content plan.
- To source appropriate speakers and liaise with them to agree content of presentations in line with the TVS' non promotional policy.
- To be the TVS representative on Industry sponsored events where appropriate - working with the company to ensure the content is educational and engaging

Conferences - Our yearly conference is the high point of our educational programme and is usually a face to face event spanning 2 days. Visiting other scientific meetings is key to collaborating with like minded organisations

- To lead the development of the scientific programme for the annual conference, giving clinical support to the Event Management Agency, suggesting pertinent topics, ideas for brilliant speakers and generally ensuring that the event fits with our ethos of 'Solving skin and wound challenges together'
- To visit educational conferences, representing the TVS in the exhibition, networking with Industry and sourcing great speakers and generally keeping the society up to date with the latest thinking
